# From the Desk of...

Rabbi David Cohen-Henriquez

## RUTH AND REVELATION

The Scroll of Ruth is read during Shavuot. The story is about a Moabite widow who follows her Israelite mother-in-law, Naomi, into the Jewish people. Ruth proclaims: "wherever you go, I will go, wherever you lodge, I will lodge, your people will be my people, and your God will be my God."

There are many explanations given for the reading of Ruth on Shavuot. One interpretation is that Ruth's coming to Israel took place around the harvest season, which was during Shavuot (also known as Chag HaKatzir, the Harvest Holiday). According to Jewish tradition the Torah was given to the Jewish People on Shavuot.

If we take the numerical value of the Hebrew letters of the name Ruth רות it gives us the number 606 ("ר" the letter "Reish" equals 200, "ו" the letter "Vav," equals six, and "ת" the letter "Tav," equals 400). On Shavuot we received 606 commandments in addition to the Seven Noachide Laws (the laws all human beings are commanded to follow), giving us a grand total of 613. Ruth had the 606 mitzvot exclusive to Jews already in her, it was just a matter of accepting the covenant and allow her inner Jew to flow. Like Ruth who converted and accepted Judaism, so too the whole nation of Israel established the covenant with God this day as they received the revelation of the Torah at mount Sinai.

Perhaps the central theme of story of Ruth is Chesed, Loving-Kindness. The story relates the love Ruth shows to her mother in law Naomi, instead of leaving her behind. The setting of the Book of Ruth around the harvest time in Israel shows us how the Jewish people, by following the laws of the Torah, treated their poor. We see the benevolence shown by the people of Bethlehem and Boaz's thoughtfulness towards Ruth.

The story of Ruth also teaches us to accept converts and commands us to treat them with loving-kindness. According to Rabbi Jonathan Sacks the story of Ruth de-ethnicizes Judaism, as did the covenant at Sinai. Being Jewish ceased to be a race and became a responsibility.

Ruth invites us to reframe the holiday of receiving the Torah, making the covenant at Sinai not only a religious act but an act of love. It is about a commitment of two parties, a pledge to one another with loyalty and dedication.

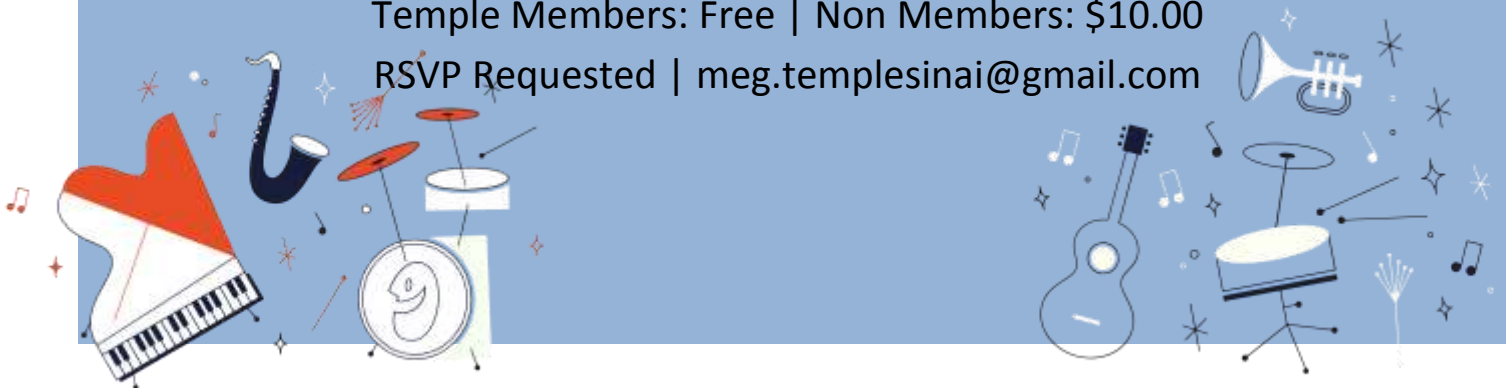

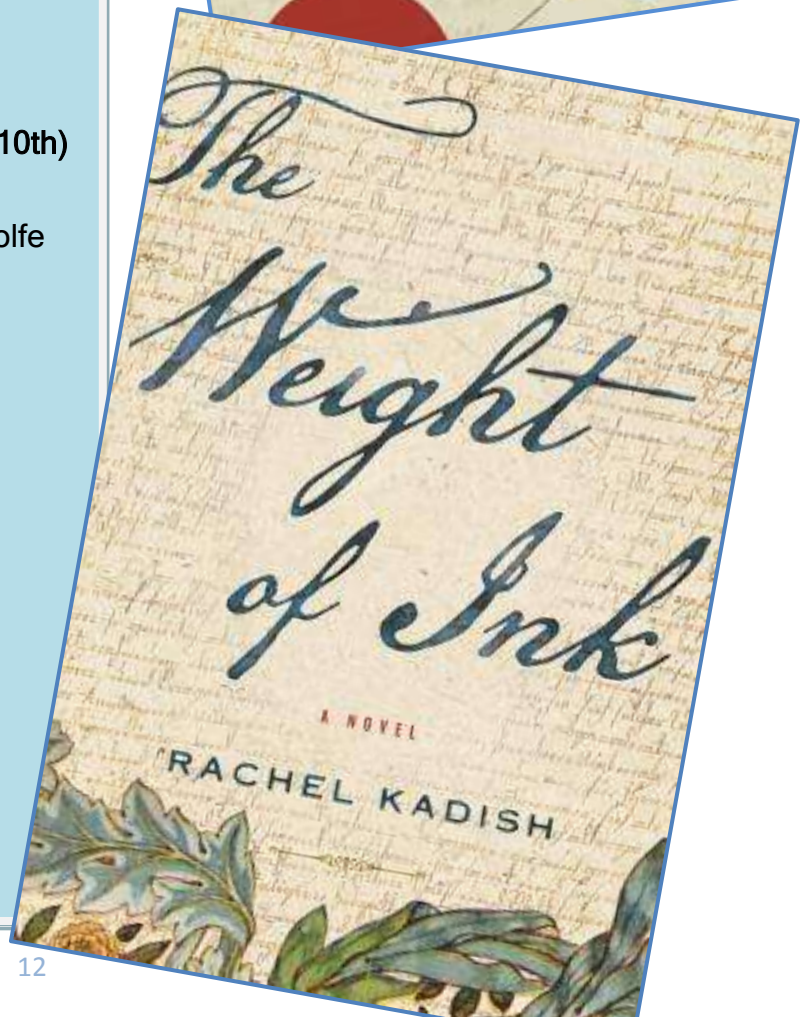
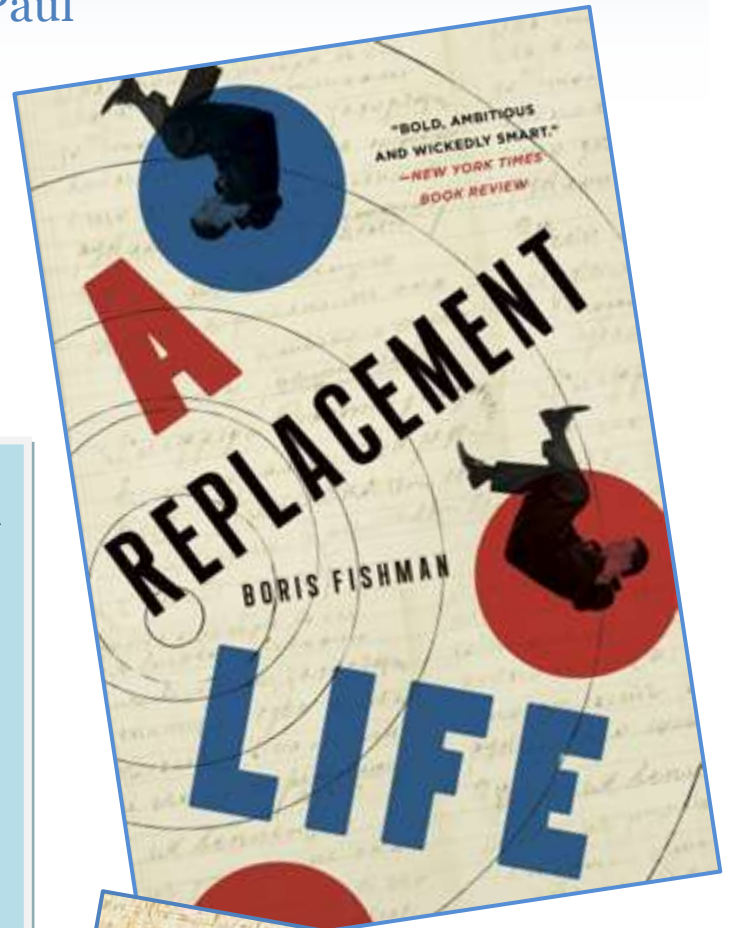

Dear Temple Sinai Family,

As you know, our synagogue is a proud recipient of a \$5000.00 grant from the CJP Ruderman Synagogue Inclusion Project (RSIP). Our committee has worked diligently in recommending and making small, incremental and noticeable steps in assuring that our synagogue, in the words of Isaiah, is truly a place of worship for all.

Look around, and you will notice some changes. Our Bimah has been brought down and now is level with the seating, so no one has to use the stairs. There are both magnifiers and hearing assisted devices. At the front door entrance, there is a mezuzah hung at a level that can be reached by someone in a wheelchair. A water jug is in Founder's Hall for everyone to access. The powder room is always open during services for those that want some quiet or rest. We have chairs with arms for those who need some extra support standing and sitting. Our verbiage has also changed: the Rabbi and Cantor have replaced "please stand", with "please rise in body or in spirit".

You might not be aware that our building lacks handicapped accessible bathroom facilities. Individuals who require these amenities actually have to calculate coming to synagogue services around their bodily needs and functions, as there is currently no place available to them. Or, these individuals are no longer coming to our synagogue.

I am writing to you to ask for your contribution for the construction of a gender neutral handicapped accessible bathroom.

Just as Bezalel was the architect for the Mishkan, we at Temple Sinai are truly fortunate to have in our midst our own Bezalel. The architectural services for the bathroom are being generously donated. Our \$5000 grant, will go towards some of our efforts, but certainly not cover the entire cost of the project, including plumbing, remodeling and supplies.

Recently, I was honored at Sisterhood Shabbat to deliver the Dvar Torah. The portion was Pekudei- Reckoning, the accounting of the building of the Mishkan. While researching texts and readings to augment my Dvar, much of the insights that I garnered could be used in this letter to our Temple family. "Let no man and woman make further effort toward gifts for the sanctuary." The people gave so generously in the building of the Mishkan, that Moses actually had to beseech people to stop giving. Imagine that! I invite you to get involved in our Mishkan here at Temple Sinai so that we too can be as proud as Moses.

The Torah records that the contributions for the Mishkan were to be taken "from every person whose heart prompted him or her to donate" to the holy project.

I realize that requesting donations for a handicapped bathroom isn't as visible, intriguing or beautiful as a Mishkan- Sanctuary. However, I fervently hope, that our RSIP project will come to fruition and truly be as the Israelites did so, a product of the entire community.

We hope to begin the project in July and be completed by Rosh Hashonah. Your generous donations are greatly needed and appreciated. Please indicate RSIP when making a donation, to insure it is credited into the appropriate account.

Please feel free to contact me or any other members of the RSIP Committee if you have any questions. On behalf of our RSIP Committee, I thank you in advance for your support of this endeavor of inclusion at Temple Sinai.

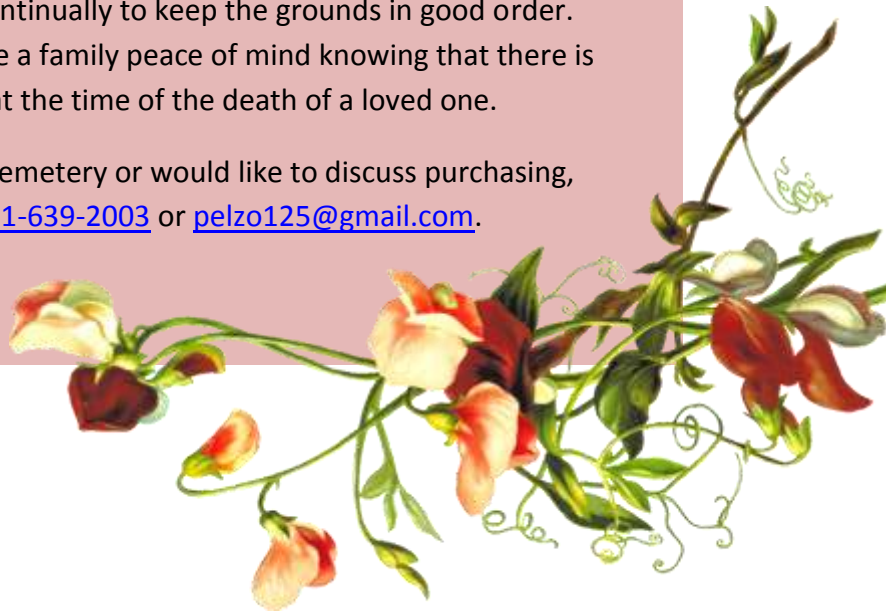
# Cemetery

Our cemetery is bounded on two sides by trees and a low stone wall on one of those sides. There are many other cemeteries in the same location. We work continually to keep the grounds in good order. Owning cemetery property can give a family peace of mind knowing that there is one less detail to focus on at the time of the death of a loved one.
